#### WHEREAS:

- 1. Larry Wood, P.Eng. ("Larry Wood") has been advised by letter dated April 5, 2005, with attachments, from the Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of the Province of British Columbia (the "Association") about a concern over his practice as a Professional Engineer;
- 2. Larry Wood understands that the Investigation Committee of the Association has reasonable and probable grounds to believe and does believe that he, Larry Wood, contravened the *Engineers and Geoscientists Act*, R.S.B.C. 1996, Chapter 116, as amended (the "*Act*"), the Bylaws or the Code of Ethics of the Association, specifically:

AND TAKE NOTICE that the allegation against you is that, contrary to the Act, you have breached the code of ethics of the Association, in that you have not conducted yourself with fairness, courtesy and good faith towards a colleague and have not given honest and fair professional comment on a colleague's work, when on or about March 21, 2005 you wrote a letter to third parties and stated that the colleague "has a history of preparing misleading, inaccurate and sensational reports and

Larry Wood understands that the Discipline Committee of the Association after an Inquiry, and a finding that the allegation set out in the Notice of Inquiry has been proven, has the power and authority, in accordance with Section 32 of the *Act*, to do one or more of; reprimand, impose conditions on membership, suspend or revoke membership, for the contravention the Discipline Committee finds Larry Wood, to have committed:
- 4. Larry Wood understands that he has the right at an Inquiry to make full answer and defence and to be represented by counsel;

- 5. Larry Wood, after seeking and obtaining independent legal advice, wishes to expedite the resolution of this matter by means of this Stipulated Order, and does not wish to proceed to an Inquiry;
- 6. This Stipulated Order will become binding when accepted by Larry Wood, and the Reviewing Member of the Discipline Committee; and
- 7. Larry Wood understands that particulars surrounding this Stipulated Order will be published in *Innovation* and a notice of this Stipulated Order may be otherwise published or distributed.

#### THEREFORE

In recognition of the foregoing, Larry Wood and the Reviewing Member hereby agree as follows:

- (a) Larry Wood, accepts that he is in breach of the *Act*, as alleged in the Notice of Inquiry dated October 3, 2005;
- (b) The Reviewing Member, after a careful review of all the information provided, has determined that an appropriate penalty is as follows:
  - 1. Larry Wood be, and hereby is, reprimanded for his conduct;
  - 2. As a condition of Larry Wood's continued membership in the Association he will prepare a letter of apology to P.Eng. for Larry Wood's comments in his March 21, 2005 memo regarding in a form acceptable to the Registrar of the Association by November 30, 2005;
  - 3. As a further condition of Larry Wood's continued membership in the Association he will immediately send the approved letter of apology to and to the Association, which will publish the letter of apology in a form and manner that the Association deems appropriate;
  - 4. If Larry Wood fails to comply with paragraphs 2 and 3 herein, he will be fined \$5,000 payable to the Association, by December 1, 2005; and
  - 5. Larry Wood will pay to the Association its costs of investigation and the inquiry in the amount of \$1,011.65 by December 1, 2005;
- (c) Larry Wood understands and accepts that the acceptance of the above penalty has the same force and effect as if the penalty had been ordered by the Discipline Committee after an inquiry pursuant to Section 32 of the *Act*; and
- (d) Larry Wood, after carefully considering this matter, accepts the above penalty.

# Stipulated Order — Larry Wood PEng, Delta, BC

A complaint was made to the Association regarding a comment made by Mr Wood about another member (the complainant). Mr Wood was a consultant for the original construction of a building and the complainant had been retained for a warranty review.

The complainant's report was provided to Mr Wood and he wrote a response to his client that included the statement "[The complainant] has a history of preparing misleading, inaccurate and sensational reports . . . ."

The complaint was investigated by the designated reviewer and the Investigation Committee, which recommended that an inquiry be held regarding Mr Wood's alleged failure to conduct himself with fairness, courtesy and good faith towards a colleague and give honest and fair professional comment, contrary to Principle 7 of the Code of Ethics.

In lieu of proceeding to an inquiry, Mr Wood accepted a Stipulated Order admitting that he was in breach of the *Engineers and Geoscientists Act* and the Code of Ethics, and accepted as his penalty:

- A reprimand;
- That he prepare an apology letter to the complainant, in a form acceptable to the Registrar, and send the approved letter of apology to the complainant and to the Association, which will publish it in the form and manner it deems appropriate;
- If he fails to provide the apology he will be fined \$5,000;

 He will pay the Association \$1,011.65 towards its legal costs for the investigation and preparation for the inquiry.

A copy of the Stipulated Order is posted on the APEGBC website; the name of the complainant and other identifying details have been removed from this notice and the Stipulated Order at the complainant's request.
